

Commemorative Project Contribution

Commemorative Project Contributions support NZ based projects that recognise veterans' sacrifice.

Who can get this

Projects may get a Commemorative Project Contribution if they:

- are NZ based, and
- commemorate NZ veterans' enduring contributions through Qualifying Operational Service.

Qualifying Operational Service explained (<https://www.veteransaffairs.mil.nz/eligibility/qualifying-service/qualifying-operational-service/>)

A project must be either a:

- reunion event
- memorial that is free to the general public
- publication
- education programmes open to NZ students, or
- NZ team's participation in the Invictus Games.

What you can get

The total contribution you may be able to get is dependent on the project's total cost. It can be up to a total of NZD\$5,000.

You'll need to supply proof of payment with your application.

Reunion


Veteran groups may seek funding for national reunions to commemorate Qualifying Operational Service.

Funding for reunions is based on \$10 per veteran, up to a total of NZD\$5,000.

How to apply

1. Complete the Commemorative Project Contribution application form.
2. Send the application form and any supporting information to us.
