

What we fund

Veterans' Affairs administers funding agreements with key partners to strengthen and extend the services available for veterans.

Ranfurly Veterans' Trust

\$37,000 in the 2022-2023 financial year.

This grant funding has been made available to focus on the wellbeing of veterans and whānau, connecting them with services and support available from a variety of agencies and organisations with local communities.

This included the planning of veterans' forums in Ōtautahi-Christchurch, Tāmaki Makaurau-Auckland and Manawatu-Palmerston North and an evaluation report at the conclusion of each event.
